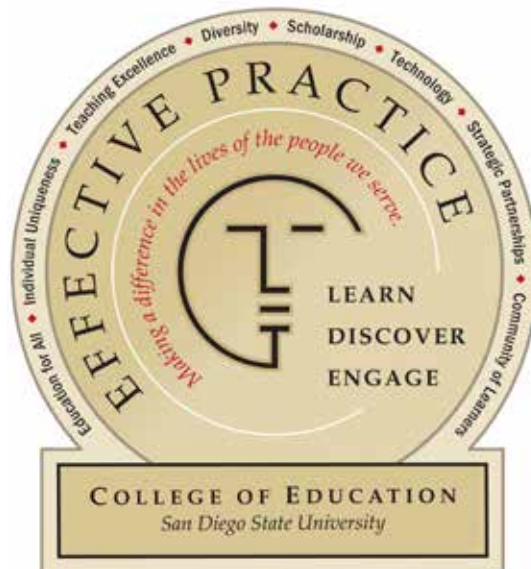




## A Message from the Dean
