Stein Education Center (SEC), a program of the Vista Hill Foundation, is a non-public school setting for students with extensive support needs. SEC was originally opened in 1973 as one of the first nonpublic school settings for children with Autism. SEC serves children, teens, and young adults who exhibit behavioral challenges or have other unique needs that require them to be in a separate school setting. Our school provides ongoing collaboration and support from special education teachers, Board Certified Behavior Analysts, speech and occupational therapists, a counselor, as well as a high ratio of classroom aides.

- Collaboration with members of the professional community to develop educational expertise, along with growing autonomy and responsibility in the classroom.
- Residents are paid at rate of \$22/hr., and receive both health and retirement benefits.
- If selected, support covers tuition (including prerequisite coursework), university fees, test fees, and supplies, up to \$16,000.
